SC / ST COMMITTEE

The institute is committed to providing an environment that promotes diversity and respects everyone, regardless of color, religious beliefs, or culture. While maintaining diversity of all kinds, it also commits to ensuring the protection of everyone, including minorities, and acting in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution of India in such matters. To create a living and working environment where all students feel safe and respected, there is a need to establish an SC, ST, and Minorities Cell with the following objectives.

OBJECTIVES:

1. To ensure the provision of an environment where all students from SC, ST, and minority communities feel safe and secure.
2. To provide prompt counseling services for emotional emergencies arising from any incidents on campus.
3. To establish a mechanism for addressing and resolving grievances of SC, ST, and minority students, if any.
4. To ensure the protection and implementation of reservation policies as provided in the Constitution of India.
5. To organize special opportunities to enhance the career growth of these students, such as coaching for competitive examinations.

The SC/ST and Minorities Cell will provide comprehensive preventive and proactive services to all students from these communities enrolled in various academic programs at the college. The goal of the cell is to enhance the psychological well-being of SC/ST and minority students, enabling them to fully benefit from the educational opportunities available at the institution. The guidelines of the UGC will be adopted from time to time.

A committee for SC/ST students has been established in accordance with the *Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989 (No. 33, dated 11/09/1989)* and as per AICTE norms.

FUNCTIONING OF SC/ST CELL:

The cell will function as a Grievance Redressal Cell to address the grievances of SC/ST students at the college and provide the necessary support in resolving their academic and personal career-related issues. Additionally, it will undertake any other tasks assigned from time to time to promote higher education among these communities, who face economic, social, and educational disadvantages.

ACTIVITIES OF SC/ST CELL:

The SC/ST Cell was established in the college to coordinate the implementation of various policies and programs launched by the Central Government, MHRD, MSBTE, and State Government for the benefit of SC/ST students.

It also undertakes activities to raise awareness among SC/ST students, particularly those from rural areas. The faculty members of the cell are actively involved in addressing and resolving issues related to SC/ST students.

Additionally, the cell announces details of free coaching programs, start-ups, government scholarships, and fellowships through circulars to SC/ST students as and when they are notified by the Central Government, MHRD, MSBTE, and State Governments.








Committee:
